-covered an editorial I wrote back in December 2001. It was my very first editorial of the Christmas edition of our monthly *Senior Times Newsletter*. What I discovered as I re-read it was just how fitting and appropriate it was pertaining to thoughts and ideals and how I truly feel about Christmas. It was so nostalgic and fitting in fact I thought it was worth repeating....so here I go!

The joy and spirit of the holiday season is among us. Christmas carols and holiday music abound. The fragrant smell of balsam trees, candles softly flickering in the night and branches glittering with light seem to heighten our senses of Christmas' past. Stockings hanging on the mantel; loved ones meeting together around the Christmas tree, which is aboundant with gifted treasures and light; with joyous memories my heart reveres. Especially at Christmas time, what I wouldn't give to hear my father's cherished voice in song or prayer, or to eat my grandmother's homemade dinner rolls and hand-rolled homemade noodle soup once more. To hear Aunt Tillie read to me "T'was the Night Before Christmas" on just one more Christmas Eve night...To see Aunt Eloise seated at her organ at church or grandpa Gress smoking his favorite pipe...To eat granny's homemade old-time hard-tack candy and creamy chocolate fudge. To see how long Pap's beard had grown... or to continue a tradition of helping my beloved mother make her famous thumbprint baked cookies and homemade nut-rolls....but most importantly, for all of us to be gathered around the dining room table for Christmas once more. To have an "old-fashioned Christmas" filled with the dearest things that I know in all the earth: home, family, and loved ones, friendship, song, and mirth.

I always try to enjoy "today" and living in the moment, but sometimes, especially during the holidays, my heart and head are pulled back to a time when, for me, it seemed like everyone was a little happier; appeared less nervous and stressed; and life was a lot less complicated and simpler.

I've obviously shared this story before, but

I'm going to share it again for a couple of reasons...one—to share a little bit about myself with you... and two—to offer you something to think about and consider, especially if the holidays are an emotionally difficult time for you or perhaps you too are looking for something motivating and inspiring to help you "cope and get through the holidays".

It was Christmas 1988. I was working for a company based out of London, England and I was working in the hotel industry as a Regional Sales Development Manager. I was sharing my time living in both Columbus and Beechwood, Ohio at the time and I decided to take some much deserved vacation time during the Christmas holiday and return home to visit my family, who lived in New Concord at the time. My grandmother, Lois Gress, whom I was very close and absolutely adored, had suffered a serious stroke and was a resident of a local nursing home. Looking back I remember I worried about her spending time alone in the nursing home during the Christmas holiday. Our entire family (grandparents, parents, siblings, aunts, uncles, cousins...the whole lot of us) had always been together at Christmas. No matter how far we strayed or lived away... each of us knew where were expected and would be on Christmas Eve!



Anytime I travelled through the area or came home on the weekend I always spent most of my time visiting with my grandparents. I always enjoyed our time together. We'd talk about life; family memories; and share stories both new and old. Who would have guessed that even back then I had an adoration and strong affection for older adults? My Great-grandmother Rose Gress

always said to me as a child "you're going to grow up and work with older people"...She lived well into her late 90's and I now realize just how truly wise and intuitive she actually

was.



On this particular return visit home it was Christmas Eve. My brother and his wife had travelled from where they lived in Georgia and arranged to be home in Ohio for the Christmas holidays too. I remember I had lots of errands to do and I had to also pick up a few lastminute Christmas gifts before I had to head home that evening for our family Christmas dinner and celebration. My father had a wonderful Christmas Eve dinner planned for all of us that evening and he was afraid I wouldn't get back in time, but I promised him I would. So, off to Cambridge I flew. I remember stopping at a few shops and stores as I picked up this and that. At one store I saw a beautiful flower that I knew my grandmother Lois had always adorned her home with during the holidays and it made me think of her. Although buying flowers wasn't in my holiday budget or plans, I bought the flowers and decided to go make a non-scheduled visit with my grandmother at the nursing home. Of course grandmother was always happy to see me, but this time in particular she seemed overly emotional. We hugged and kissed and she wrapped her arms around me and gave me a great big hug. She loved the flowers, but seemed a little sad she wasn't going to be able to be dismissed until Christmas Day. As I looked into her eyes I saw a sadness I had never seen before.

We sat awhile. We talked and visited. Soon it was time for her to eat dinner. Knowing she had some difficulties feeding herself as a result of her stroke, I stayed and helped her eat. I remember how I got her to laugh when I made silly noises when I feed her just like she used to do for me when I was a child. It was nice to see "that sparkle" she had always had in her eyes once more. Astonishingly I totally lost all track of time. Before I knew it I was already 20 minutes late for Christmas dinner at my dad's and it would take a good 15 more minutes to get from Cambridge to where we lived in New Concord. Remember...we didn't have cell phones back then. So, I called home from the nursing home and told my brother to please share the news that I was on my way. I remember him saying "Dad's not real pleased...just hurry and get here, but be safe". I assured him that I would. So I drove as fast as I could. Unfortunately, I got behind a little traffic jam on the Interstate-70 and regretted I hadn't taken Route 40 West toward New Concord.

I remember when I arrived home and walked through the door I was shocked to see that the dinning room table had been cleared except for one place setting. My step-mother explained that they couldn't wait any longer and that my father was terribly upset. They had gone ahead and eaten without me. I remember I felt awful and I tried to explain why I was late, but my excuses seemed to somehow fall short. I rarely disappointed my father, but on this occasion I felt absolutely wrought with guilt. I explained that I felt bad for grandmother who was all alone, but also realized the unfortunate thing I had done. Not to ruin our Christmas more than I already had we all moved to the Family Room to open and share our gifts. We had a wonderful evening and my father seemed to warm to the idea of why I was so late. He later told me he didn't like what happened, but understood what I'd done and why I chose to do it. He knew coming from me; who I was; that this behavior was "totally like me"-to care more about others than what recourse my actions might have upon me. At least I hoped he understood. He did make me feel a little better, but it was a lesson I never will forget. Later the next day

on Christmas Day we picked grandmother up from the nursing home; carefully transported her to the family homestead; where we all enjoyed our annual traditional Gress family Christmas dinner with the entire Gress family. Those are cherished memories I will never ever forget.

Christmas 1988 will always be symbolic and very memorable for me...and, not necessarily for the happiest of reasons. You see, little did I know then that that particular Christmas would be my last Christmas I would ever spend with my father. Sadly, he died of an aortic aneurysm just five months later, at the young age of 46 in May 1989. We never got to spend another Christmas together. I was still a young man at the time and remember thinking I'd never have the opportunity to "make up" for that last Christmas. My dad would never live to see Christmas 1989. It's been 37 years and many Christmas' have come and gone since then. There were those difficult "first holidays" we've all experienced and have to get through. Christmas' changed for me back then, but I've never lost hope of what Christmas "truly is" and "means to me". It's a time for family; spending quality time with loved ones; but more importantly a very special birthday celebration of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. My father would have turned 83 years old this coming December 31st. He was a "New Year's Eve Baby" born in 1942. Even though I've spent more years without him than I did with him I still miss him terribly. I will always love & remember him fondly as I begin each "New Year". The reason I share this story—as I mentioned earlier was for two very distinct reasons. The first, as I shared, was to share a little something about me personally. The second, as I also shared, was to give you something to consider and to think about, especially during the holiday season. What I'd like for you to consider and give some thought to is... We never know when our last Christmas with those we love might be". So, I encourage you to "make the time"! Extend an olive branch! Make peace in your family, and spend this holiday with

family or dear friends that you love & cherish most. Reclaim your joy!

I consider myself to be very blessed in my life to have a loving family and close knitcircle of dear friends to spend time with during the holidays. Not everyone does, which is why we encourage seniors to also befriend and support one another, especially during the holidays. I am especially grateful for my own family and friends, most especially my mother. I am also very grateful for our many friends, supporters, and community partners, employees, and volunteers who are all so extremely kind, dedicated, and generous. I'd like to take this opportunity to thank everyone in advance for your generosity, kindness, and support of the mission of both the Guernsey County Senior Citizens Center and Meals on Wheels Guernsey County. Each of you are very important to us and we sincerely care about each and every one of you. No matter if you randomly "stop by and visit us" at the Guernsey County Senior Citizens Center or stay for awhile and enjoy fun-bingo, lunch, an afternoon activity, or simply enjoy a cup of hot cocoa or tea among friends, we hope that you take part in the many activities and events we've planned throughout the holiday season that you have a very blessed and joyous Christmas. There is no need to be alone or feel lonely this holiday season. Make the most of today! Find joy in the smallest and simplest of things. We cordially invite you to sit back, relax, unwind, and enjoy a lovely holiday season with all of us here at the Senior Center. Together, my staff and I send you our sincerest, warmest, and most heartfelt holiday wishes for a Blessed Christmas and a Healthy & Happy New Year! May you and yours have a very blessed & Merry Christmas!

Utility Assistance Available For Senior Citizens

Heating Assistance Available Application Deadline: May 31, 2026

The Ohio Department of Development and the Area Agency on Aging, Region 9 want to remind older Ohioans that assistance is available to help with their home energy bills. The Home Energy Assistance Program (HEAP) helps Ohioans at or below 175% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines for a household of up to seven members and 60% of State Median Income for a household of eight or more members to pay their heating bills.

Applied directly to the customer's utility or bulk fuel bill, the benefit can help manage heating costs. Older Ohioans may go to their local Area Agency on Aging office for help with assembling the required documents and completing their HEAP application. They may also visit www.energyhelp.ohio.gov to apply online or to download a copy of the application.

When applying, individuals need to have copies of the following documents:

- Most recent utility bills.
- •A list of all household members (including birth dates and Social Security numbers).
- Proof of income for the past 30 days for all household members (12 months for certain income types).
- Proof of U.S. citizenship or legal residency for all household members.
- Proof of disability (if applicable).

HEAP benefits are applied to an individual's energy bill after Jan. 1. Applications for the HEAP program must be received by May 31, 2026.

Utility Assistance Available For Senior Citizens

Energy Assistance Available to Reconnect/ Avoid Disconnection of Utilities

Ohio's electric and natural gas customers have the opportunity to use the Winter Reconnect Order (WRO) during the winter heating season from October 18th through April 15th to reconnect or to avoid disconnection of their utilities. The WRO applies only to Ohio's investor-owned electric and natural gas utilities and does not apply to municipally owned utilities or rural electric co-ops. To apply, contact your utility company.

The order allows any electric or natural gas customer of an investor-owned utility to avoid disconnection or to reconnect their service for \$175, even if the customer owes more and cannot afford to pay the entire balance.

It is always recommended to speak with a representative of the utility company or your local community action agency before using the WRO.

Contact your local community action agency, located at 185 S 2nd St, Byesville, by calling (740) 685-2422 or (740) 685-2423 for additional information. If you would like someone to assist you in talking to your utility company, you can call the Public Utilities Commission (PUCO) by calling 1-800-686-7826.

Dollar Energy Fund & Neighbor To Neighbor Program Assistance

Dollar Energy Fund and AEP Ohio have teamed up to create a program that will assist low-income AEP Ohio customers who have difficulty paying their electric bill. The program will provide eligible customers with a utility assistance grant applied directly to the AEP Ohio bill. This grant will help low-income customers maintain or restore their basic electric service.

Eligible Households

- 1. Must be a customer of AEP
- 2. Be at or below 250% of the Poverty Income Guidelines (FPIGs), a family of four earning up to \$65, 500 per year is eligible.
- 3. Have made a sincere effort of payment on their AEP bill. A sincere effort is a minimum of \$75 in the last 90 days. Exceptions for senior citizens will apply.
- 4. Have a minimum balance of \$100 on their AEP bill.
